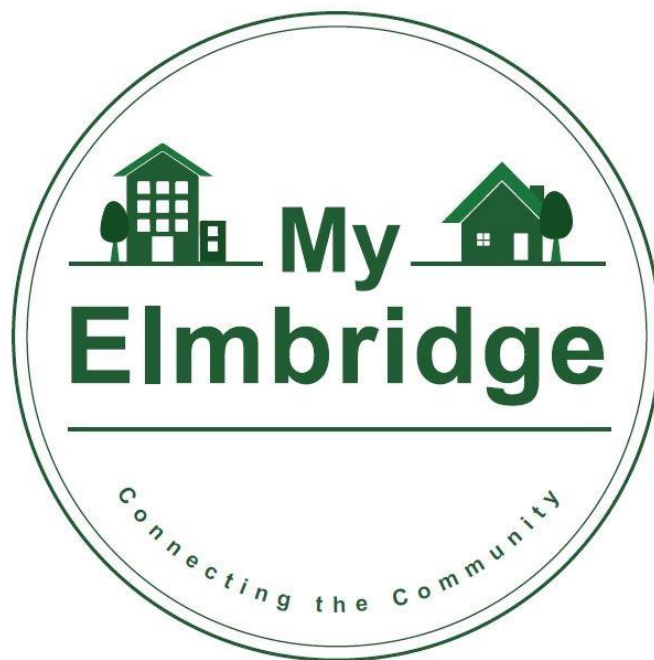

We will facilitate economic growth, including improved infrastructure and housing

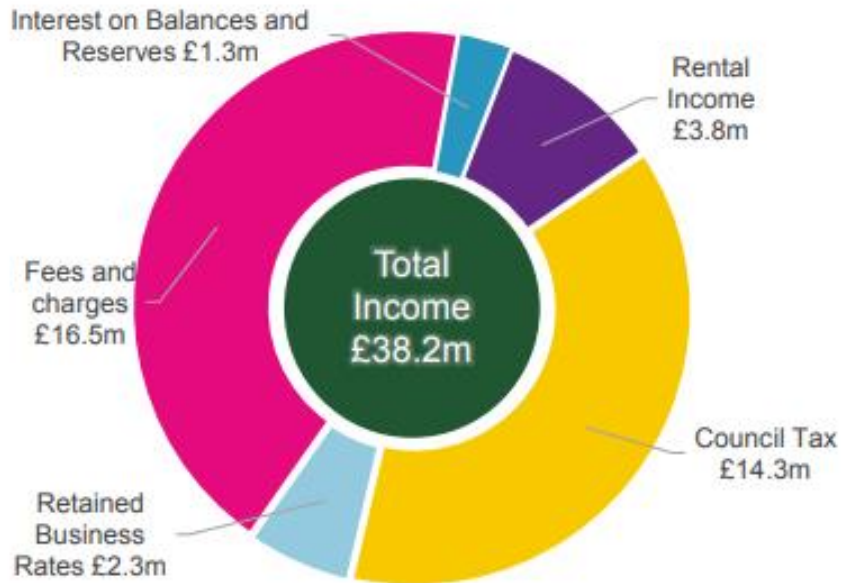
Climate Change

We will respond to climate change emergency by taking measures to make council operations carbon neutral by 2030

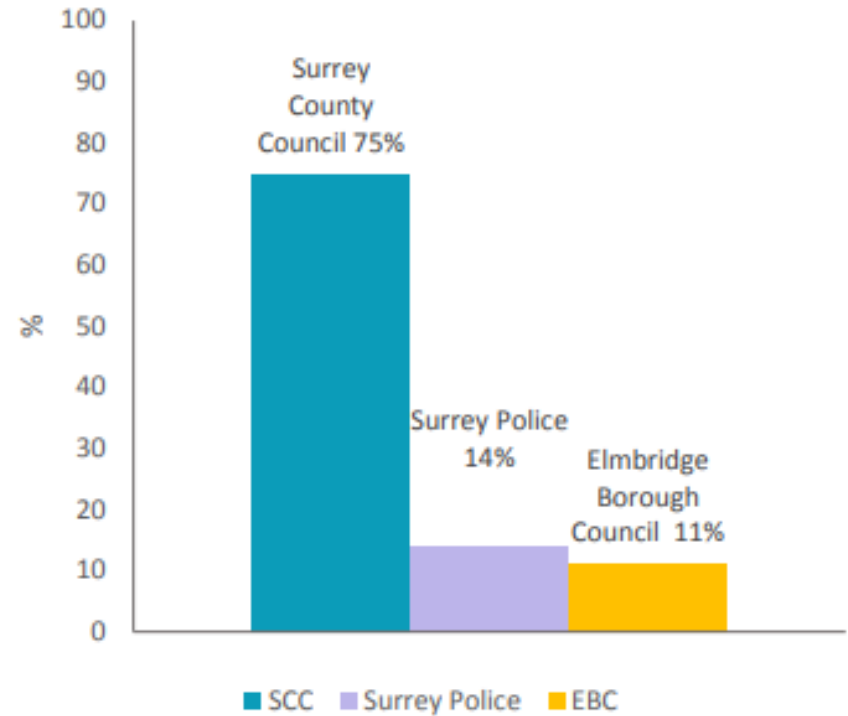

Where the money comes from



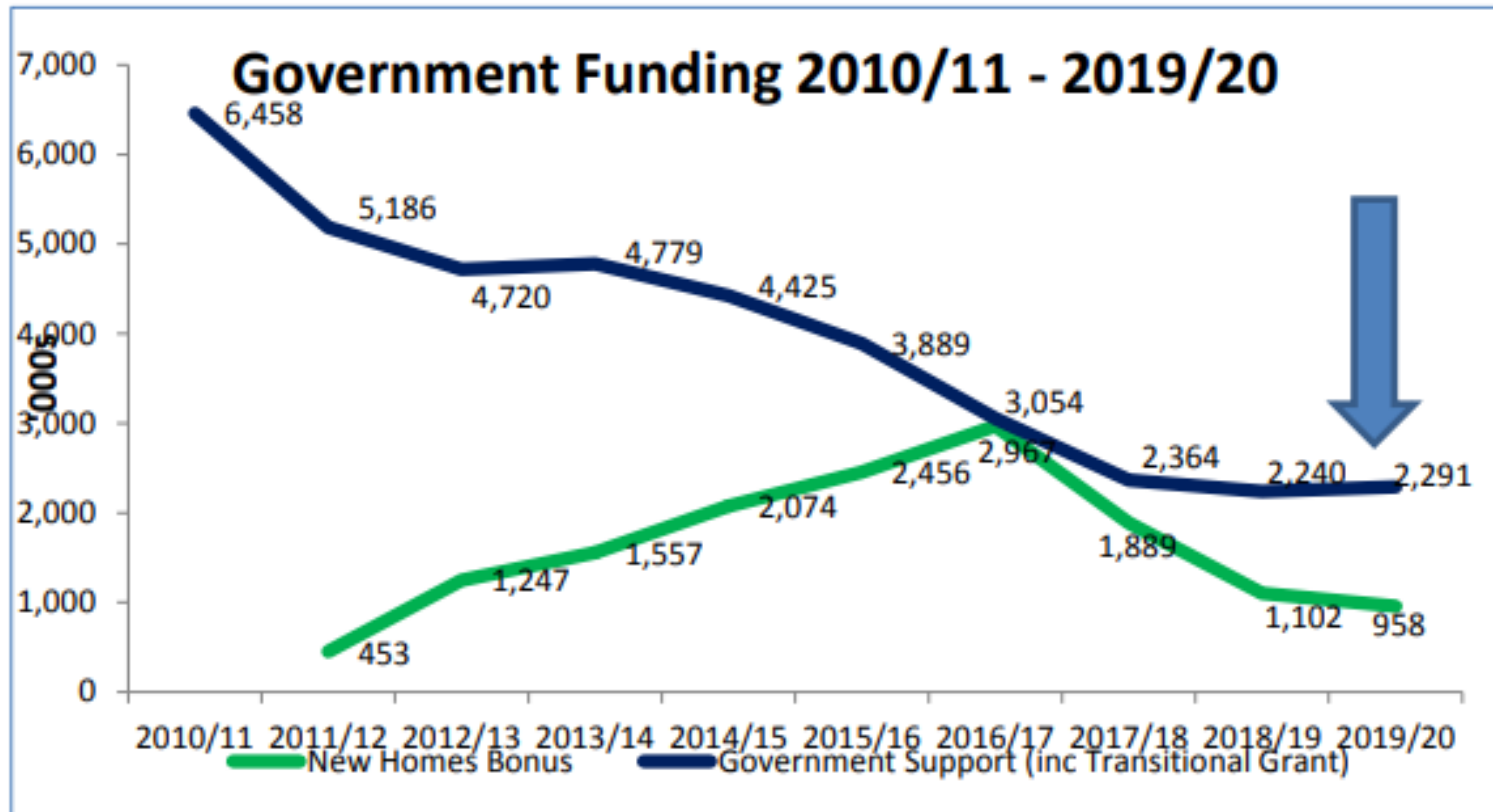
Who spends your Council Tax

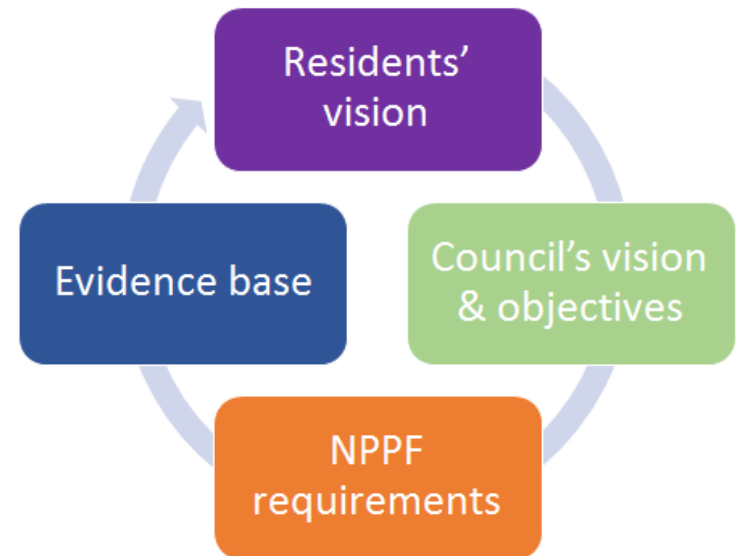

- Include strategic and detailed policies to deliver sustainable growth.
- Statutory requirement and our duty to have an up to date Local Plan.
- Without an up to date Local Plan, the Council risks Government intervention & speculative applications for development.
