


# Design a flower bed Competition

## Useful tips:

Colours, patterns and shapes are important.


Patterns must be bold and simple enough to be planted. Try and avoid too intricate details. Simple flowerbed designs are the best.

## How to submit your entry:

- Draw your design on an A4 sheet using a similar circular shape as shown overleaf
- Use a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 6 colours.
- Remember, the actual flower bed is a 3 metre wide circle.
